

**OPEN ENROLLMENT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS:**

**Cory-Rawson Local Schools**

The Cory-Rawson Board of Education has adopted an Interdistrict Open Enrollment Policy as follows:

In compliance with ORC 3313.98, the Cory-Rawson Board of Education shall permit enrollment of students who are residents of school districts that are adjacent to the boundaries of the Cory-Rawson School District or any “other district” (as defined in O.R.C. 3313.98) with respect to grade level capacities, building capacities, and program capacities as established by the Cory-Rawson Board of Education. Below are the guidelines applicable to this policy:

1. Applications may be picked up at the Cory-Rawson superintendent's office. One application must be submitted for each student who requests an interdistrict transfer. Any application for an interdistrict transfer must be submitted to the Cory-Rawson superintendent's office. Once applications are acted on parents will be asked to indicate acceptance of transfer.

Cory-Rawson will notify the superintendent's offices of other districts upon the acceptance of a student into the Cory-Rawson Schools.

2. No interdistrict transfer will be permitted if the enrollment of the grade level being requested in the Cory-Rawson Schools exceeds the following:

3. Enrollment in a special program, i.e. Gifted, LD, DH, etc., will dictate which building a student must attend since many units are cooperative among several school districts and may not be housed in the district to which a student is transferred.
4. Districts are not required to institute any special education programs to serve transfer students. If the student is evaluated for placement in a special education program, representatives of the district of residence must be invited to participate in the placement meeting.
5. All approved transfers are in effect for a term of one (1) school year at a time and may be discontinued at the discretion of the Cory-Rawson Board of Education in subsequent years.
6. Applicants shall be considered on a first come, first serve basis with an assurance that native students will not be displaced. All applications will be dated and have the time recorded upon receipt in the superintendent's office. A student participating in interdistrict open enrollment from preceding years will be given priority over new applicants.
7. Applicants may be rejected if the racial balance of either the sending or receiving school district will be negatively impacted.
8. The Ohio H.S. Athletic Assn. eligibility guidelines will be in effect.
9. The Cory-Rawson School District will accept no responsibility for the transportation of students from other districts unless it is deemed practical by the administration. Parents/guardians are responsible for transporting students to an established bus stop in the Cory-Rawson School District or to bring the student(s) directly to the appropriate building.
10. The Cory-Rawson School District may deny enrollment to students who have been suspended or expelled for ten consecutive days in the current semester, or the semester immediately proceeding.
11. All credits earned by entering high school students from adjacent or non-adjacent districts will be accepted. However, once enrolled in Cory-Rawson Local Schools, students will be required to meet all Cory-Rawson High School graduation requirements including passing all required parts of the Ohio Ninth Grade Proficiency Test, if applicable, or the Ohio Graduation test in order to receive a Cory-Rawson High School diploma.
