COVID-19 VACCINE UPDATE:

Ohio is making the COVID-19 vaccine available to 91,000 K-12 school personnel throughout our state. Due to the scarcity of the vaccine, the process is expected to take weeks but Ohio's goal is to have all first doses administered by the end of February. We will be working with the Hancock County Educational Service Center and Meijer to receive our staff vaccinations which are scheduled for Saturday, February 27, 2021.



Immunization Scheduling (from Hancock County Public Health):

Many people are unaware that childhood immunization schedules are based on age and not on grade. Please make sure that you are staying on schedule. If your child is age 4, 11, or 16 please schedule their next appointment! Call 419-424-7441 to make an appointment or for more information.

The Ohio Department of Education understands the current situation with Covid-19 has increased the need for substitute teachers to help schools and districts remain open during the coronavirus pandemic. In response, the Department has been granted the authority (HB 409 of the 133rd General Assembly; Section (3)) to issue a one-time non-renewable one-year temporary non-bachelor's substitute teaching license for the 2020-2021 school year. An

eligible applicant who does not hold a postsecondary degree must meet the employing school or district's set of education requirements.

One-year temporary non-bachelor's substitute teaching licenses now are available at the request of the employing school or district. These licenses are valid for teaching in an assigned class of any subject area and grade level in the employing school district for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year. Applicants must have current background checks on file with the Department.

CALAMITY DAYS VS. REMOTE LEARNING DAYS

To date, Cory-Rawson Schools has used 4 of 5 Calamity Days that we are permitted in a school year. In looking at the weather forecast, as well as living in Ohio, chances are good that we will use our last calamity day soon. When we begin our Remote Learning Days Schedule please note the following:

Grades K-6:

In the event of calamity days beyond the 5 days allowed contractually Cory-Rawson Elementary School will be utilizing Remote Learning in the place of makeup days and Blizzard Bags like we have used in the past. All students have a device that they are able to use for this purpose now distributed from the school. Attendance will be taken in the same way that it was when students were remote learning during the hybrid schedule. Students and Parents will be required to sign into the Google Form for daily attendance by 7pm the day of a cancelation (the Google Form can be found on the CR Elementary Portal Page or by clicking this link: [Remote Learning Attendance Form](#)). We understand that students may not be available during the day due to various caretaker situations on a calamity day so we are hoping that signing in by 7pm helps to accommodate all families schedules. Because of this any student who does not sign in will be counted absent for Remote Learning Days if they have not filled out the form. If you have issues with the form please email Mrs. Lambert, lambert@cory-rawson.org, to notify her that you have attempted to check-in but were unable to.

Instruction will come in the form of scheduled Zoom Calls and/or video lessons provided by your student's teachers. All students will have an opportunity to do a Zoom Call with their homeroom teacher at 10:30am. During this call homeroom teachers will be going over assignments for the day, where to access them, and clarify any questions that may come up. If your child is not present during this zoom call they are still responsible for successfully completing the assignment posted by their teacher. If further clarification of the assignment is needed students may contact their teacher at any point throughout the day from 9:45am to 3:15pm, just like a typical 2-hour delay schedule.

- K-3 grade teachers will be required to provide a video lesson for both Reading and Math by 2pm. Teachers may post video lessons that are pre-recorded or they may provide live instruction via Zoom to be recorded and posted for students to view or review later if unavailable prior to 3:15pm. If teachers choose to pre-record they will still be available at some point in the afternoon for a Zoom call for those who need that option.
- 4-6 grade teachers will be required to be available on the following schedule for students to Zoom and ask questions they may have on the assignments communicated during the 10:30am Zoom call with their homeroom teacher. These calls will follow this schedule.
 - 1pm: 4th Grade Science, 5th Grade Math, 6th Grade ELA
 - 1:30pm 4th Grade Math, 5th Grade ELA, 6th Grade SS
 - 2pm 4th Grade ELA, 5th Grade SS, 6th Grade Science
 - 2:30pm 4th Grade SS, 5th Grade Sci, 6th Grade Math

These Zoom calls will provide a brief lesson related to the assignment as well as time for students to ask questions and receive feedback on the assignment communicated earlier in the day during the 10:30am Zoom call.

- Zoom calls will be recorded and posted on Google Classroom for any student who is not able to join the Zoom call as scheduled above.
- Phys Ed, Art, and Music teachers will be required to provide an assignment for the class they would have met by 10:30am. There will be no Zoom times offered for Specials on calamity days, however teachers will be available to communicate with students/families from 9:45am-3:15pm.

Grades 7-12:

Student attendance will be taken on REMOTE LEARNING DAYS. The attendance link will be at the bottom of morning announcements, just as it has been all year long. Students are expected to log in no later than 10:00 to be counted in attendance for the day.

Students are expected to be working on their assignments, as given by their individual teachers. If a student has a question, the

teachers are accessible by email and by zoom appointment from 8-3:00 with the exception of junior high teachers who will have a lunch break from 11:00-11:30 and the high school teachers will eat from 11:30-12:00.

If students experience any problems with internet connection, they should reach out to Mrs. Welch and/or Mrs. Gaietto and let them know.
